# With Your Support -- New Slides are On The Way!

As you will undoubtedly notice, the two, 50-foot-long hill slides in the play-ground area of the park have disappeared! FORFP board members had been discussing ways to make repairs since last season, but the slides rapidly became too damaged to repair over the winter. This spring, after consulting with several land-scape professionals, Town officials decided that the slides and their support structures had to be removed for safety reasons.

Now there is a hole where one of the best features of the park used to be, and we need your help. The Town of Arlington does not have the funds to replace the slides without additional financial support. Preliminary estimates by equipment vendors show that this custom installation will be expensive! Knowing that there are many friends of this beautiful park and playground, the Friends of Robbins Farm Park has decided to launch a fundraising campaign to ensure that the missing slides are replaced soon with safer, more durable

new slides.

Bids for new slides cannot be accepted until the start of the Town's fiscal year on July 1, 2011, but fundraising can begin now!

On Monday, May 9 at 6:30 pm the Arlington Park and Recreation Commission will hold a public meeting at the Senior Center. Landscape architect Andrew Leonard will present his plan and a preliminary budget. Please come to this meeting if you have thoughts to contribute or would like more information.

# **Park and Playground Update**

This past winter, the FORFP Board said "farewell" to long-time hard working board member Jen Rothenberg and wished her well in her work on the Park and Recreation Commission.

Three new red maple trees have been supplied by the Town of Arlington for FORFP volunteers to plant and water in the lower playground area. These maples will provide shade near the picnic tables. They will be sited carefully to avoid blocking the view.

The Robbins Farm Garden project has once again been approved by the Park and Recreation Commission, the administrator of the program. Last year's pilot program was successful, and this year the garden has expanded in size to about 30' x 68'. The garden will be open to visitors and will be a learning opportunity for those who visit in person or online at www.robbinsfarmgarden.org. # FORFP reaffirms recently mandated dog rules and regulations



At a recent board of directors meeting of the Friends of Robbins Farm Park, we discussed the issue of having certain park areas open to dog owners who wish to allow their animals off leash, at specific times of day.

We believe the merits of Warrant Article 36 of the 2010 Town Meeting and the recently mandated rules and regulations allowing for off-leash dogs in the park are proper and reasonable. The Board agreed to fully support these mandates and will endeavor to promote them to users of the park. We believe they are written to consider the concerns of all park users and the neighborhood surrounding the park. These thoughts were communicated via letter to the Board of Selectmen.

The off-leash program is one of a variety of public uses that we feel is in alignment with our mission: to encourage the enhancement, use and preservation of Robbins Farm Park. We recognize that the park should be available for multiple uses and that users should be respectful of all our neighbors.


We are working out the details, but we are hopeful that we will have two or even three concerts at the park this summer.

# Trash! New Carry In, Carry Out Policy at Robbins Farm

Trash barrels! That's where the juice and pizza boxes, empty water bottles, and all manner of waste generated by humans (and the occasional four-legged friend) end up at the park.

Then: It was considered good citizenship to take an extra few steps to locate a trash barrel and pitch the trash, rather than litter. Kids generally learned this "lesson" at home and school.

Now: Consider it your civic duty to "take it with you." The Town's park maintenance budget is severely curtailed, and it is a labor-intense chore to individually tip and replace each barrel. So the Town will not be collecting trash in the off season, and pickups may be less frequent in the summer months. Be prepared, bring a plastic bag, and adopt the new way of "carry in, carry out" at the Park.

This helps keep our park beautiful, clean, and litter free, whatever the season!
